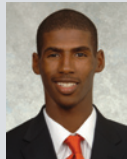


#### CALVIN HAYNES

So. • G • Oregon State

Coming off an explosive freshman debut, Haynes spent his sophomore season solidifying himself as one of the conference's top scorers.

Haynes earned First Team All-Pac-10 accolades by averaging 14.1 points per game and placing himself among the Top 20 in the conference. Haynes scored a career high 24 points to lead his team to a win over Seattle in December. Aside from scoring, Haynes contributed 3.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game and a total of 26 steals for the season.



#### STEFON JACKSON

Sr. • G • UTEP

The nation's fifth best scorer and second in Conference USA, Jackson averages 24.3 points per game. He leads the country in free throws made (274) and

attempted (329). He is the all-time leading scorer in UTEP history with 2,420 points. He has fourteen 30-point games putting him among the top in Miner history. On December 30, Jackson posted a career-high 44 points in an OT loss to Santa Clara. He was also pegged to the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-District VII Team for the second year in a row.

### CBI CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES GAME 2 RECAP

**UTEP 70, Oregon State 63**  
**Don Haskins Center • El Paso, Texas**

UTEP got 28 points and 10 rebounds from Stefon Jackson in a 70-63 win over Oregon State on Wednesday, forcing a Game #3 in the CBI Championship Series tonight in El Paso.

Jackson scored 22 of his 28 points in the second half, including nine points during a key 14-2 run midway through the second half. That run turned a four-point deficit for the Miners (44-40) into an eight-point lead (54-46), and they never looked back. Guard Randy Culpepper added 17 points, while Arnett Moultrie added 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Oregon State led by as many as eight points in the first half, but UTEP was able to cut it to a 35-30 deficit by halftime. Roeland Schaftenaar led the Beavers with 17 points and eight rebounds. Seth Tarver added eight points and 15 rebounds.

**HEAD COACH** - Craig Robinson (first season), 17-18 (.486) at Oregon State

**ABOUT OREGON STATE** - First year Head Coach Craig Robinson led the Beavers to the fifth best single season turnaround in Pac-10 history. After the Beavers went 0-18 in conference play a year ago, Robinson came to Corvallis and led his new team to a 7-11 conference record, including a sweep of the Bay Area schools (Stanford & Cal). Oregon State placed three players on the All-Conference team, including Seth Tarver, who became the first Oregon State player to lead the Pac-10 in steals since Gary Payton in the 1989-90 season.

**HOW THEY GOT HERE** - The Beavers beat Houston, Vermont and Stanford to make it to the Championship Series, with the wins against Vermont & Stanford needing overtime. Oregon State has won their four games in the CBI Tournament by a total of 14 points. The Beavers' offense has been very efficient in their last three victories, shooting 53.3% from the field (44% from three-point range) in that period. Roeland Schaftenaar leads the Beavers, averaging 14.0 ppg in the CBI Tournament (18.0 ppg in the Championship Series).

**ABOUT UTEP** - Under Coach Tony Barbee, UTEP has displayed steady improvement each season, posting 6-10 league mark in 2006-07, 8-8 in 2007-08 and 10-6 this year. Over the course of the season, Stefon Jackson became the all-time leading scorer in C-USA and was tabbed to the United States Basketball Writers Association All-District VII Team for the second year in a row. Freshman Arnett Moultrie was also selected to the C-USA All-Freshman Team.

**HOW THEY GOT HERE** - The Miners reached the Championship Series with wins over Nevada, Northeastern and Richmond. Their wins have been by an average of 7.5 points, and the Miners are the third highest scoring team in this year's tournament (74.8 ppg). Guard Stefon Jackson has shattered the tournament record for total points (131), averaging 26.2 ppg in the 2009 CBI. Off the bench, guard Randy Culpepper has added an average of 18.6 points per game. Forward Arnett Moultrie has averaged 12.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game in the five games so far.

## ABOUT THE CBI

The College Basketball Invitational (CBI) provides a meaningful opportunity for teams that are deserving of a postseason experience. Sixteen teams compete in this new postseason event, hosted at on-campus arenas throughout the country.

The CBI is a single-elimination tournament, up until the Championship Series, with all games played at campus sites. The Championship Series is a best of three series.

The event features eight first-round games, four second-round (or quarterfinal) games, a semifinal round and then a Championship Series.

Bracketing is conducted geographically into four regions of the country (East, West, South, Midwest) to minimize missed class time. The goal of the brackets is to create a competitive balance within each region. The final process takes place after the NCAA Tournament field is announced.

The 16-team field consists of teams not selected for the NCAA Tournament. Teams are invited based upon performance during their conference and non-conference schedule, as well as how well the team is playing at the end of the regular season.

## 2009 CBI TOURNAMENT NOTES

**Bigger and Bigger** – The 2009 CBI Tournament has already produced four of the top six crowds in tournament history...

- 12,000** – Oregon State at UTEP (4/1/09)  
9,014 – Tulsa at Bradley (4/2/08)
- 8,812** – Stanford at Wichita State (3/23/09)  
8,455 – Bradley at Tulsa (4/4/08)
- 8,029** – UTEP at Oregon State (3/30/09)
- 7,798** – Northeastern at UTEP (3/23/09)

**The sellout crowd for Game #2 of the Championship Series on April 1st was the first sellout for UTEP in four years.**

**Total Attendance** – With a crowd of 4,778 or larger, this year's CBI Championship Series will surpass the 2008 CBI Championship Series in total attendance. Last year, the series between Tulsa and Bradley drew 24,806 fans for the three games. After two games, the UTEP/Oregon State series has drawn 20,029 fans.

**Oregon State vs. UTEP** – Tonight's game is just the fifth meeting all-time between the schools, with the series tied at 2-2.

**Down To The Wire** – The 2009 College Basketball Invitational has produced the most competitive games among the postseason tournaments...

- 7.2 – average margin of victory in CBI
- 9.2 – average margin of victory in NIT
- 13.0 – average margin of victory in NCAA

**Wins, Wins and More Wins** – CBI Tournament teams have combined for 325 wins this season ... an average of 20.3 wins. They also averaged 10.1 wins in conference play.

**Scoring Machine** – UTEP guard Stefon Jackson continues to add to his career point total, which now stands at 2,420

after his 28-point effort against Oregon State in Game #2 of the CBI Championship Series. Jackson had 34 points against Richmond in the semifinals and consecutive 26-point efforts against Nevada and Northeastern to open up the tournament. His career total is the most in Conference USA history.

**Scoring Machine, Part II** – Jackson has scored 131 points in the tournament this season, breaking the CBI record for points in a single tournament (104). His teammate, Randy Culpepper, could break the old record as well tonight. He sits at 93 points.

**A Glory Road** – UTEP has won more than two games in a postseason for the first time since 1966. That year, UTEP (then Texas Western College) won the NCAA Title, beating Kentucky in the title game. That team, coached by Don Haskins, was the first NCAA team to start five African-Americans. Their story was later brought to the "big screen" in the movie "Glory Road".

**Uncharted Territory** – Oregon State has won four games in a postseason tournament for the first time ever. Wednesday's game marked the first time that the Oregon State Men's Basketball team had ever played a game in April. The last time that an Oregon State basketball team played this late in the postseason was 1949-50, when Head Coach Slat's Gill and the Beavers reached the NCAA Final Four in Seattle, Wash. That year, Oregon State's last game took place on March 25th.

**C-USA vs. Pac-10** – Conference USA and the Pac-10 teams have matched up six times so far in the 2008-09 season, with the C-USA winning just two of the matchups. UTEP's win on Wednesday, as well as a win by UAB over Arizona, are the only C-USA victories this season against the Pac-10.
