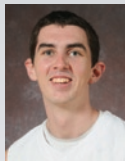
PLAYERS TO WATCH

Named to the Colonial Athletic Association first-team, becoming JMU's first first-team honoree since David Fanning in 2003...also earned first-team

All-District honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches...he is just the fourth player in JMU history to record multiple 500-point seasons with 16 total 500-point seasons in program history...in December he poured in 34 points and 13 rebounds in a win over Marshall for his second career 30-point, 10-rebound performance.

Averaging 11.9 points and 6.3 rebounds for the Wildcats...was a preseason All-SoCon choice after a solid freshman season that saw him named the league's

ABOUT JAMES MADISON – The Dukes are 21-11...this marks the 12th 20-win season in the 42-year history of the program, and second in the last 10 years...first-team All-CAA honoree Denzel Bowles leads JMU with a 17.8 ppg scoring average and an 8.8 rebound per game average...Devon Moore scores at an 11.3 ppg clip and has handed out a team-best 133 assists...the Dukes went 10-8 in the CAA, placing sixth...this is the Dukes' second postseason berth in the last three years.

HOW THEY GOT HERE – James Madison placed sixth in the CAA and fell in the opening round of the CAA Tournament...the Dukes are 6-8 against postseason teams this season.

ABOUT DAVIDSON – Went 17-14 in earning a berth in the CBI presented by Zebra Pen...sophomore guard JP Kuhlman paces the Wildcats with a 12.6 ppg average and 93 assists...sophomore forward Jake Cohen nets 11.9 points an outing and hauls a down a team 6.3 rebounds a game...head coach Bob McKillop is in his 22nd season, has won 400 games, and has posted double-digit wins 17 times, including each of the last 10 years...the Davidson roster features nine underclassmen, including four sophomores and five freshmen...the Wildcats have just 11 total years of Division I experience in their rotation...only 25 teams have less experience than Davidson...eight of the top nine scorers for the Wildcats are freshmen or sophomores.

HOW THEY GOT HERE – Went 10-8 and finished fourth in the south division of the Southern Conference.

The 16-team field consists of teams not selected for the NCAA Tournament. Teams are invited based upon performance during their conference and non-conference schedules, as well as how well the team is playing at the end of the regular season.

Fourth Annual CBI presented by Zebra Pen

The fourth annual CBI presented by Zebra Pen tips off on March 15 with four Opening Round games, with four additional Opening Round games being played on March 16. The Quarterfinals commence on Monday, March 21, followed by Semifinal Round action on Wednesday, March 23.

The unique quality of the CBI presented by Zebra Pen is it's best-of-three Championship Series, which will be held March 28, March 30, and April 1. One team will host two games should a third game be necessary.

Breeding Success

Six participants in the 2010 CBI presented by Zebra Pen earned berths in the 2011 NCAA Tournament: Akron, Boston University, Indiana State, Morehead State, Princeton, and VCU. Below is a look at how other postseason tournaments fed into this year's NCAA Tournament:

Tulsa (2008) and Oregon State (2009) won the first two CBIs. Both series went the distance as Tulsa won Games 1 and 3 against Bradley in 2008 and Oregon State did the same in 2009 against UTEP. Last year, VCU became the first team to need only two games to win the CBI crown.
