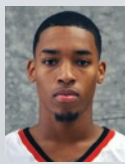

PLAYERS TO WATCH



TYSHAWN EDMONDSON Jr. • G • Austin Peay

Named to the first-team All-OVC squad for leading the Govs in scoring 26 times in first APSU season...netted 20 or more points on 13 occasions and scored in

double digits in his first 16 APSU games...one of only two OVC players to record two 30-point games (he had 33 on the road at Eastern Illinois in December and Tennessee State in January)...his seven three-pointers against Tennessee State were a league best this season...in settling on Austin Peay as his basketball home this season, he crisscrossed the country some 4,000 miles to St. John's as a freshman, then to Midland (Texas) C.C. as a sophomore before landing almost home in Clarksville, Tenn., which is 30 miles away from his hometown of Hopkinsville, Ky.



LA'SHARD ANDERSON Sr. • G • Boise State

Completed the regular-season as the WAC leader in steals (2.4 spg)...also ranked second in assists (4.8 apg) and fifth in scoring (15.5 ppg)...garnered two WAC Player of the Week honors this season, and was named first-team All-WAC, WAC All-Defensive, and WAC All-Tournament...became Boise State's all-time single-season leader in assists this season, and also climbed into the top four on the Broncos' single-season steals list...ranks second all-time in career steals and fifth on the career assists list...needs just nine points to become the 21st player in school history to reach 1,000 for his career.

ABOUT AUSTIN PEAY – The Governors are making their 10th postseason appearance as a Division I program, including six NCAA tournaments...at 20-13, APSU has won 20 games for the 14th time in school history and the sixth time under head coach Dave Loos...when Loos took over Austin Peay's basketball program 21 years ago, the Govs held 165-207 all-time league mark...they are now 388-340, including 13-5 this season...Loos is the only Division I basketball coach in the country who also serves as his university's athletics director...junior TyShawn Edmondson earned first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors...Edmondson netted 20 or more points 13 times this season.

HOW THEY GOT HERE – Posted a 20-13 record and advanced to the semifinals of the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament, where they lost to eventual champion and 2010 CBI participant Morehead State.

ABOUT BOISE STATE – The Broncos won each of their final seven regular-season games...only eight teams completed their regular-season with a longer winning streak...Boise State ended the regular-season ranked second in the nation in turnover margin, forcing 5.4 more turnovers per game than committing...the Broncos have won 20 games for just the ninth time since becoming a four-year institution prior to the 1968-69 season...in posting 20 wins, Boise State was 9-7 on the road during the regular-season, tied for the sixth-best mark nationally among teams that had played at least 16 road games through March 7...first-year head coach Leon Rice currently owns the best winning percentage (20-12, .625) for a first-year head coach in school history...since Boise State joined the WAC prior to the 2001-02 season, the league has seen 19 first-year head coaches, and only four have posted a higher winning percentage than Rice.

HOW THEY GOT HERE – After going 10-6 in the Western Athletic Conference, the Broncos earned the No. 2 seed and made the finals of the conference tournament, falling to No. 23 (AP)/17 (ESPN/USA Today) Utah State, 77-69.

The 16-team field consists of teams not selected for the NCAA Tournament. Teams are invited based upon performance during their conference and non-conference schedules, as well as how well the team is playing at the end of the regular season.

Fourth Annual CBI presented by Zebra Pen

The fourth annual CBI presented by Zebra Pen tips off on March 15 with four Opening Round games, with four additional Opening Round games being played on March 16. The Quarterfinals commence on Monday, March 21, followed by Semifinal Round action on Wednesday, March 23.

The unique quality of the CBI presented by Zebra Pen is it's best-of-three Championship Series, which will be held March 28, March 30, and April 1. One team will host two games should a third game be necessary.

Tulsa (2008) and Oregon State (2009) won the first two CBIs. Both series went the distance as Tulsa won Games 1 and 3 against Bradley in 2008 and Oregon State did the same in 2009 against UTEP. Last year, VCU became the first team to need only two games to win the CBI crown.
