

## ANTHONY REED • Troy (1986-90)

One of the most tenacious competitors in the history of the Troy Trojans program, Anthony Reed is truly a Troy legend. Always known to boast that he never lost a pick-up game during his time at Troy, Reed also saw a great deal of success on the hardwood for the Trojans.

A rare four-year starter, Reed holds the Troy career scoring record with 1,875 points scored. He also holds the Troy record for highest single-season scoring average with his 24.4 ppg mark he set as a senior during the 1989-90 season. That year averaged a double-double, adding 10.5 rebounds per game to his scoring efforts while helping the Trojans to a 23-7 mark overall. As a sophomore, the Hayneville, Ala., native helped push Troy to

a Division II runner-up finish. Reed scored more than 30 points six times in his career. He also holds the Troy records for free throws made (363) and attempted (671) in a career. Reed set the school record for free throws attempted in a game with 21 attempts against West Alabama in 1990. During his four years at Troy, Reed's teams compiled a record of 79-36, including back-to-back-to-back 20-win seasons in his last three years.
