SEVENTH ANNUAL COLLEGE BASKETBALL INVITATIONAL

The seventh annual CBI tipped off on March 18 with one Opening Round game, followed by seven additional Opening Round games played on March 19. The Quarterfinals and Semifinal Rounds were played last week.

The unique quality of the CBI is its best-of-three Championship Series, which began Monday at Fresno State before moving to Siena for Game 2 and today's winner-take-all Game 3.

As a matter of fact, the 2013 CBI saw nine games decided by six points or less, four decided by one point, and six won by the road team. This year, nine games have been decided by seven points or less, five road teams have won, and the margin of victory is 8.9 ppg.

DID YOU KNOW...

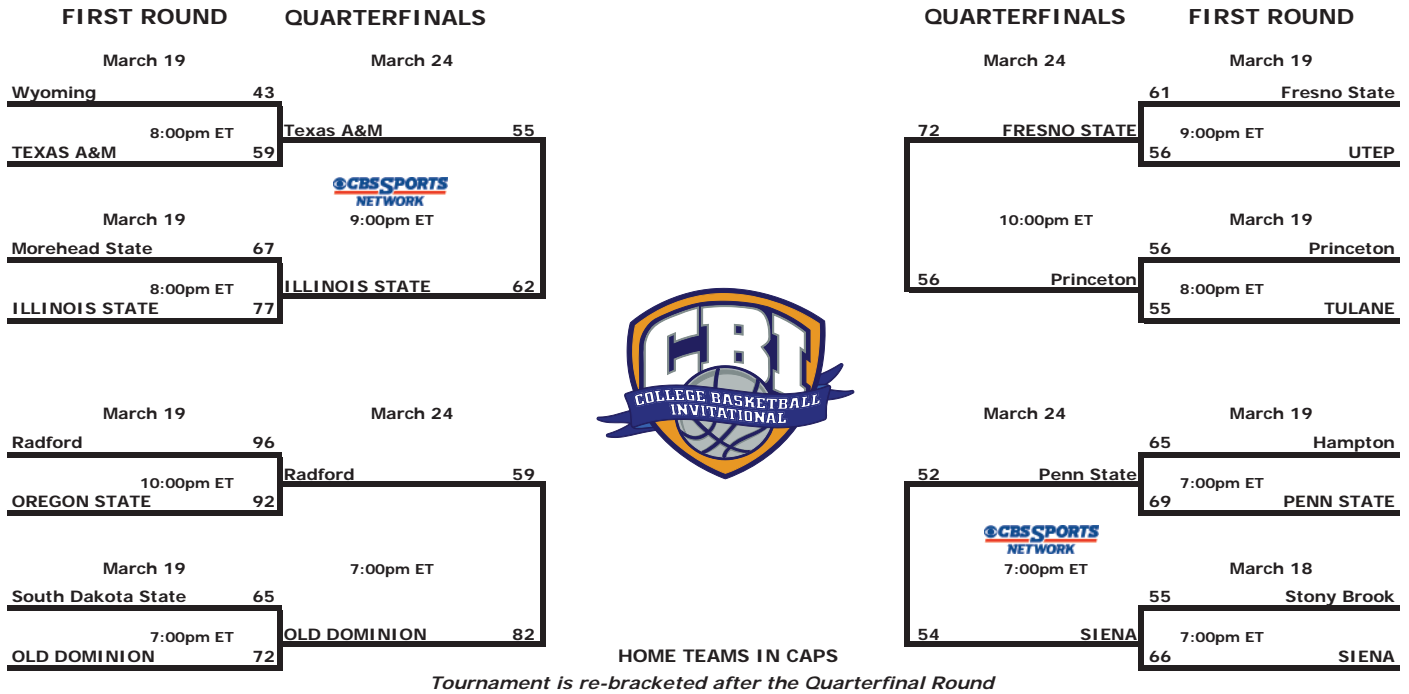
Five of the previous six tournament Championship Series went the distance as Tulsa (2008), Oregon State (2009), Oregon (2011), Pittsburgh (2012), and Santa Clara (2013) won in three games. In 2010, VCU became the only team to need two games to win the CBI crown. On Monday, Siena became the first team in the seven-year history of the CBI to win the Championship Series opener on the road. 2013 also marks the first time the visiting team has won the first two games of the Championship Series.

THAT'S A FACT

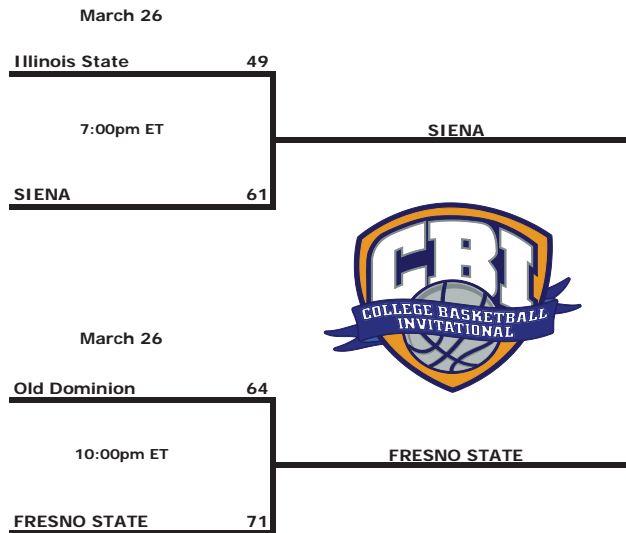
In the previous six Championship Series, the team that won the first game went on to win the Series four times. The two times the game one winner lost the Series were in 2011 and 2012 when Creighton opened with a victory against Oregon (2011) and Washington State beat Pittsburgh in its opener (2012).

Samples of CBI Success

- North Dakota State and Western Michigan both won their respective league regular season and tournament championships and Tulsa won its postseason tournament after playing in the 2013 CBI.
- Texas parlayed its 2013 CBI experience into a No. 7 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns were ranked as high as No. 15 in 2014.
- Pittsburgh won the 2012 CBI and earned a No. 8 seed in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- After advancing to consecutive NCAA championship games, Butler played in the 2012 CBI, advancing to the semifinals. They followed that with a No. 6 seed in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- 2012 - Creighton, Davidson, Montana, and St. Bonaventure all won their respective league tournaments after playing in the 2011 CBI.
- VCU won the 2010 CBI and advanced to the Final Four the next season.
- Creighton advanced to the Championship Series of the 2011 CBI and in 2012 was ranked as high as 13th (AP) and 12th (ESPN/USA Today).
- Oregon won the 2011 CBI and went 24-10 the following season, surpassing the previous season's win total, which included five CBI wins.
- Morehead State played in the 2010 CBI and the next year had, arguably, the greatest season in school history.
- Saint Louis advanced to the final of the 2010 CBI with a team featuring seven freshmen, four sophomores, and one junior. Those seven freshmen headline the 2013 Atlantic 10 regular season and tournament champions, earning a No. 4 seed in the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- Richmond advanced to the semifinals of the 2009 CBI and went on to earn back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids for the first time in 19 years.
- UTEP reached the Championship Series of the 2009 CBI and went on to advance to the 2010 NCAA Tournament and win 51 games the next two seasons.
- Tulsa won the 2008 CBI prior to winning 48 games the next two years.
- Utah played in the 2008 CBI and went on to win 24 games the next season and reach the NCAA Tournament for the first time in four years.

It Happened in the CBI

- By advancing to the Championship Series of the 2014 CBI, Fresno State has reached the championship of a postseason tournament for just the second time in school history (1983). Siena, on the other hand, earned its first-ever trip to a postseason championship since moving up to Division I in 1976-77.
- Bryant made its first-ever postseason appearance when it hosted Richmond in the First Round of the 2013 CBI.
- In back-to-back games in the 2012 CBI, Oregon State posted the two highest field goal percentages in CBI history. In the Opening Round against Western Illinois, the Beavers set the record by shooting 30-46 (.652) from the field. The next game against TCU in the Quarterfinals, OSU shot 39-60 (.650) from the field - the second-best effort in tournament history.
- On March 14, 2012, Western Illinois played in its first-ever postseason game.
- On March 13, 2012, Princeton scored 95 points in a 95-86 win at Evansville in the Opening Round of the CBI. It was the most points scored in regulation by the Tigers since 1995.
- On March 16, 2011, UCF beat St. Bonaventure, 69-54, for the school's first-ever postseason win. UCF would go on to advance to the semifinals of the CBI that season.
- On March 16, 2011, Rhode Island beat Miami (Ohio), 76-59, in the Opening Round of the CBI. The win was the 90th for the Rams' senior class of Marquis Jones, Will Martell, Delroy James, and Ben Eaves, tying them as the winningest four-year class in school history.
- On March 16, 2011, Rhode Island's Delroy James posted the first triple-double in school history with his 22-point, 11-rebound, and 10-assist effort in a 76-59 win over Miami (Ohio).
- On March 15, 2011, Hofstra's Charles Jenkins scored his 2,500th career point in the Opening Round of the CBI - his final game as a member of the Pride. Jenkins ended his career as Hofstra's all-time leading scorer with 2,513 points.
- On March 31, 2010, VCU became the first team in CBI history to win the Championship Series in two games, taking a 71-65 win at Saint Louis. The next season the Rams would become the first CBI champion to play in the NCAA Final Four.
- On April 3, 2009, Oregon State beat UTEP to capture the first-ever postseason championship in school history as the Beavers earned the CBI title with an 81-73 win in El Paso.

How We Got Here

First Round - March 18

In Albany, the seventh annual CBI began with Siena taking a 66-55 decision from Stony Brook.

The Saints (16-17) received a game-high 20 points from Rob Poole, who also had five rebounds and a pair of steals. Brett Bisping added 17 points, six rebounds, and two blocks. Stony Brook (23-11) ended its season led by Jamal Warney and his 15 points, 10 rebounds, and five blocked shots. Anthony Jackson scored 13 points and Carson Puriefoy had 10 points.

First Round - March 19

In State College, D.J. Newbill scored 19 points as Penn State held off Hampton, 69-65.

Brandon Taylor posted 14 points and eight rebounds, Tim Frazier had 10 points and seven rebounds, and Geno Thorpe added 10 points and five rebounds for the Nittany Lions (16-17), who outrebounded Hampton by a 41-18 count. Hampton (18-13) was led by Brian Darden and his game-high 22 points and the 19-point effort of Deron Powers.

In Norfolk, Dimitri Batten scored 18 points and Ambrose Mosley had 16 points and six rebounds to lead Old Dominion to a 72-65 win over South Dakota State.

Richard Ross added 12 points and Aaron Bacote had 10 points and five assists as the Monarchs improved to 17-17 on the season. South Dakota State (19-13) received 16 points from Jordan Dykstra, 14 points and 12 rebounds from Cody Larson, and 15 points from Zach Horstman. Marcus Heemstra added nine points and seven assists.

In New Orleans, T.J. Bray registered 12 points and nine assists as visiting Princeton withstood a late Tulane rally to emerge with a 56-55 win.

Trailing by seven with 31 seconds remaining, Tulane's Jonathan Stark sank a three-pointer to cut the lead to 56-52. After a missed Princeton foul shot, Stark nailed another three-pointer with one second remaining to bring the Green Wave to within one, 56-55. However, time expired and the Tigers won their 21st game of the season to improve to 21-8. Joining Bray in double figures for Princeton were Hans Brase with 16 points and Clay Wilson with 11 points. Stark led Tulane (17-17) with a game-best 20 points. Tre Drye recorded 15 points and eight rebounds.

In College Station, a smothering Texas A&M defense held Wyoming to just 14-of-47 shooting from the field as the Aggies came away with a 59-43 win.

Kourtney Roberson led Texas A&M (18-15) with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Antwan Space and Fabyon Harris scored 11 points each with Space also hauling down 11 rebounds. Alex Caruso added six points and 10 assists. Wyoming (18-15), which was 5-of-24 from three, received 10 points from Jerron Granberry.

In Normal, host Illinois State garnered a 77-67 win over Morehead State.

Daishon Knight paced Illinois State (17-15) with 18 points. Bobby

Hunter tallied 16 points, Nick Zeisloft had 13 points, and Reggie Lynch put up 12 points and eight rebounds. Kareem Storey led all scorers with 19 points while also handing out five assists for the Eagles (20-14). Angelo Warner posted 14 points and six rebounds and Brent Arrington netted 13 points.

In El Paso, Cezar Guerrero's jumper with 5:06 remaining broke a 49-49 tie and propelled Fresno State to a 61-56 win at UTEP.

Guerrero ended the game with 19 points, 10 rebounds, and five assists as the Bulldogs improved to 18-16 on the season. Marvelle Harris tallied 14 points. UTEP (23-11) was paced by John Bohannon and his 18 points and seven rebounds. Julian Washburn netted 16 points and Vince Hunter had four points and 10 rebounds.

In Corvallis, Radford took a 57-45 lead at halftime and held on to earn a 96-92 win at Oregon State.

The Highlanders (22-12) placed five players in double figures, led by Ya Ya Anderson and his 23 points. R.J. Price (20 points), Javonte Green (19 points), Rashun Davis (14 points), and Jalen Carethers (10 points) also netted double digits. Oregon State (16-16) was led by Roberto Nelson and his game-high 26 points. Hallice Cooke and Eric Moreland each scored 23 points, and Angus Brandt totaled 14 points.

Quarterfinal Round - March 24

All four home teams won their Quarterfinal Round games to advance.

In Albany, Evan Hymes' lay-up with four seconds to go gave Siena a 54-52 win over Penn State.

In a game in which the lead never exceeded eight points, Penn State's Brandon Taylor tied the score at 52-52 with 10 second to play. Hymes, then took the ball from midcourt, drove right and converted the lay-up for the winning bucket. Hymes ended the day with five points. The Saints (17-17) were led by Lavon Long and his 17 points, Brett Bisping posted 12 points and 12 rebounds, and Rob Poole tallied 11 points.

Penn State (16-18) received a 17-point, seven-rebound effort from D.J. Newbill.

In Norfolk, Richard Ross scored a career-high 23 points and hauled down 10 rebounds to lead Old Dominion to an 82-59 victory over Radford. In all, five Monarchs (18-17) scored in double figures. Joining Ross was Dimitri Batten with 14 points, Ambrose Mosley with 15 points, and Aaron Bacote and Keenan Palmore each with 10 points.

Radford (22-13) was led by Javonte Green with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Ya Ya Anderson added 11 points.

In Normal, Daishon Knight had game highs of 17 points and nine rebounds as Illinois State earned a 62-55 win over Texas A&M.

The Redbirds (18-15) shot 24-of-55 from the field as opposed to the Aggies going 18-of-53 from the floor. Knight was joined in double figures by John Jones, who netted 12 points. Nick Zeisloft and Bobby Hunter each had eight rebounds for ISU.

Texas A&M (18-16) was paced by Antwan Space and his 15 points and six rebounds. Jamal Jones added 14 points and nine boards and Kourtney

Roberson had 11 points and seven rebounds.

In Fresno, Tyler Johnson recorded 23 points and eight rebounds to lead Fresno State to a 72-56 win over Princeton.

Fresno State also received 15 points and six rebounds from Cezar Guerrero and 13 points from Paul Watson to improve to 19-16 on the season.

Princeton (21-9) was paced by T.J. Bray and his 17 points and six assists and Hans Brase, who added 19 points and 10 rebounds.

Semifinal Round - March 26

Siena and Fresno State will meet in the best-of-three Championship Series of the College Basketball Invitational, beginning Monday.

In Albany, Siena jumped out to a 9-0 lead and Illinois State missed its first 10 field goal attempts as the Saints earned a 61-49 win over the Redbirds.

Brett Bisping posted game highs of 20 points and 13 rebounds to pace the Saints, who improve to 18-17 on the season. The 18 wins mark a 10-win improvement for Siena from a year ago. Rob Poole tallied 14 points and Ryan Oliver had 11 points to join Bisping in double figures.

Illinois State (18-16), which was only 2-of-21 from three-point range, received 15 points, seven rebounds, and five blocked shots from Reggie Lynch. Daishon Knight, the Redbirds' leading scorer at 13.3 ppg, was shut down by a Saints defense that limited him to just 3-of-14 shooting, resulting in 11 points.

In Fresno, Marvelle Harris scored 20 points and Fresno State came away with a 71-64 win over Old Dominion.

Paul Watson tallied 15 points, Cezar Guerrero scored 14 points, and Tyler Johnson recorded 13 points and seven rebounds. As a team, the Bulldogs (20-16) shot 20-of-38 from the field and outscored ODU 27-8 at the foul line.

Old Dominion (18-18) received 14 points and six rebounds from Dimitri Batten, 12 points and seven rebounds from Denzell Taylor, and 11 points and six boards from Keenan Palmore.

Championship Series Game 1 - March 31

In Fresno, Siena overcame a 12-point second half deficit to pick up a 61-57 win at Fresno State in the first game of the Championship Series of the College Basketball Invitational.

Trailing 40-28 after an Alex Davis dunk with 16:49 to play in the game, Siena closed the game with a 33-17 run, highlighted by a tenacious press that helped force 15 Fresno State turnovers.

Lavon Long led Siena (19-17) with 13 points before fouling out. Ryan Oliver posted 10 points and six rebounds and Rob Poole added 10 points.

Fresno State (20-17) was paced by Cezar Guerrero and his 15 points, six rebounds, and five assists. Davis and Marvelle Harris scored 12 points apiece and Tyler Johnson netted 10 points.

Championship Series Game 2 - April 2

Fresno State shot a blistering 16-of-21 (.762) from the field in the first half to enter intermission with a 19-point lead en route to taking an 89-75 decision at Siena to even the CBI Championship Series at one game apiece.

The Bulldogs (21-17) also hit on 46.7 percent of their three-pointers (7-of-15) in the first half in building a 43-24 halftime margin. The lead peaked at 24 points (62-38) with 13:15 minutes to go and never got closer than 13.

Tyler Johnson led Fresno State with 19 points. Paul Watson tallied 14 points, Cezar Guerrero had 13 points, and Marvelle Harris netted 11 points.

Brett Bisping paced Siena (19-18) with a game-best 20 points while Marquis Wright had 14 points and six rebounds.
